Exciting News at the COP



Dear Pharmily,

The Fall 2021 semester is well underway. Much has happened, is happening, or is evolving. I would like to take a minute of your time to bring you up to speed on several key issues that are of interest at our college.

Significant work is being done on the Bienville Building. In August 2020, Hurricane Laura damaged the Bienville Buildings roof. Repairs scheduled to be performed in June 2021 were delayed and began September 27th. The two-week repair should be finished by October 15th in time for our Homecoming festivities.

The college has regional campuses in New Orleans and Shreveport supporting both the didactic and

experiential educational missions of the Doctor of Pharmacy program. The Shreveport campus had been housed off Claiborne Avenue near Oschner-LSU Hospital since the Mid-2000s. In August, the college moved the campus to the 10th floor of the Chase Building in downtown Shreveport (425 Travis St.). The new facility includes a state-of-the-art studio classroom, a spacious student lounge, and generous office space for up to 9 faculty members. The new digs and office views are truly beautiful. Stop by and visit if you have the opportunity.

COVID-19 has been in the United States for over 19 months. Mask use, social distancing, quarantine, and isolation are terms now routinely part of our American vocabulary. With the availability of the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines in December 2020, vaccination has become a community interest and a political platform.

Regardless of an individual's politics, the college has been asked for and responded to ULM requests for leadership in our university's efforts to assure a safe campus environment. In Spring '21, the college led university efforts to provide vaccinations to our campuses and community. In Fall '21, the university and student government asked for our help in advocating for the safety of and urgency of vaccination for all faculty, staff, and students at our campuses. Three video segments were developed by our pharmily to accomplish this task. These video segments can be found on our College of Pharmacy Facebook Page or YouTube Channel. I am proud of all our pharmily members who participated in the development of these videos

and hope you are too.

These efforts to advocate for a safe campus environment are paramount if we wish to return to normal (ie, our 2019 normal business efforts). Great steps were taken to meet this vision with Fall 2021. All college courses are back to normal face-to-face delivery, with required mask use, this semester. In person student meetings, student events (like Boo-n-Bop), and pharmily-wide events (such as the Homecoming Super Tailgate) are planned to be held with appropriate precautions in place. I am excited to re-engage in the total college experience, one where social get togethers allow development of the life-long comradery and interpersonal networks that make attending college such a special opportunity.

Our Homecoming events are examples of these important social get togethers and we are fortunate to be able to restart the alumni reception and super tailgate over the weekend of October 22nd-23rd. The Alumni Reception will occur on October 22nd from 7PM-9PM at the College of Pharmacy Building (1800 Bienville Dr.). Our Super Tailgate will be held on October 23rd from Noon until game time at the front lawn of Warhawk Field (baseball field behind Malone Stadium). Lunch should be served around 2 PM.

As you can see, much is happening at the college and I have only scratched the surface. Please join us at our homecoming festivities. We would love to see you and share more of the great things we have going on!

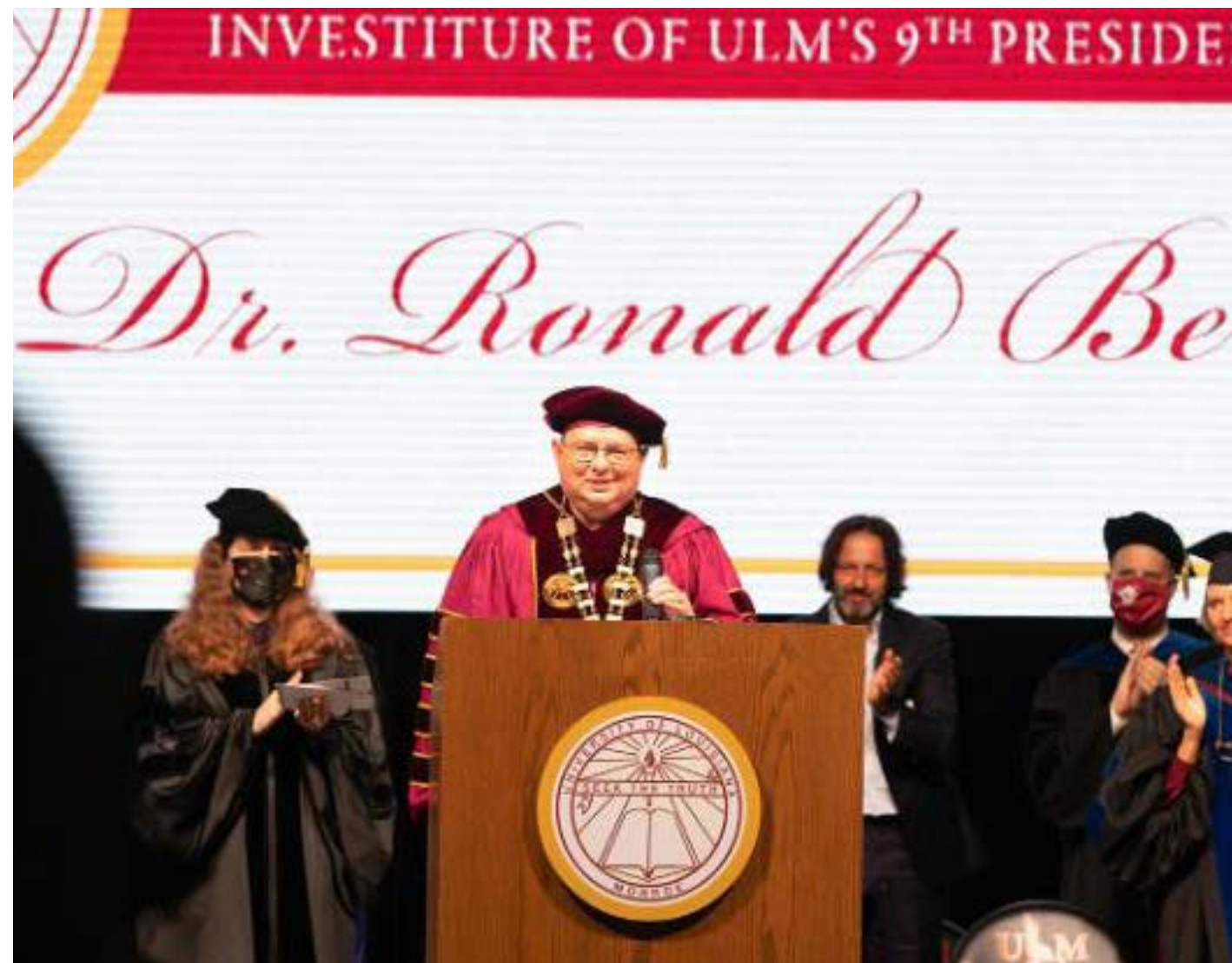
Pharmacy Super Tailgate Map

CELEBRATING THE PRESENT

ULM's 90th year celebrated with investiture of 9th President Ron Berry



An historic event took place at the University of Louisiana Monroe when an investiture ceremony for the university's ninth president was held during the week of the institution's 90th anniversary.

On Oct. 1, 2021, President Ron Berry received the university medallion and symbolic mace, just a few days and 90 years since the institution's first day of classes on Sept. 28, 1931.

The investiture processional went from the ULM Library to Fant-Ewing Coliseum, led by the Sound of Today Marching Band. President Berry and his wife, Dr. Christine Berry, were followed by the Executive Council and distinguished guests, deans, and faculty of the four colleges, staff, and students.

Special guest speakers included former president Dr. James Cofcr, Commissioner of Higher Education Dr. Kim Hunter Reed, Faculty Senate President Dr. Janelle McDaniel, alumnus and ULM employee Erick Burton, Jr., ULM alumnus and former faculty member Miguel Perez; and President and CEO of the UL System Dr. Jim Henderson.

ULM First Lady Dr. Christine Berry spoke on the Berrys' journey to the presidency

"Over a year and a half ago, when Ron entered the presidential search, it was still a dream that seemed almost impossible at times. But because of the support of this faculty, this staff, these students, these alumni, this community, this whole region, we did it. This is us," Berry said.

"We achieved what we thought would be an impossible dream. And now that we have seen what we can do, let's keep dreaming, let's dream bigger," she said.

Henderson reflected on Berry being chosen for the presidency in September 2020, saying, "Selecting presidents is not a science; it's not an art; sometimes, it's just being at the right place at the right time and finding the right candidate."

"Finding the right candidate, when you do it, when you get it right, it's an extraordinary feeling. We got it right with Ron Berry," Henderson said.

Joined by the First Lady and McDaniel, Henderson conducted the formal investiture.

"Dr. Berry, it is a great privilege for me, with the authority vested in me under the constitution of the state of Louisiana and through the Board of Supervisors of the University of Louisiana System to formally invest you as the ninth president of the University of Louisiana Monroe," Henderson said.

Berry then made his first comments as the invested ninth president.

"Christine and I are truly honored to be here with you today as well as to have the opportunity to serve our community and the campus as the ninth president and first lady of the University of Louisiana Monroe," he said.

"It is a task that both of us take on with the utmost

of seriousness, appreciation, and honor. We pledge to serve you, our university, and our community with our passion and our energy, our talents, and with selflessness. And to always represent ULM with honesty, integrity with gratitude, and with true servant hearts."

"The University of Louisiana Monroe must continue to serve proudly as an anchor for this community as it has done for the past 90 years. At the same time creating the momentum, innovation, and creativity to move our region and our students boldly toward the future," Berry said.

"I know with your help we will be the best in the world at what we do. This I pledge to you. Our students, faculty, and staff; our community deserves no less."

Following investiture, President Berry and Dr. Christine Berry had pizza with students in the concourse at the coliseum. A brunch for faculty and staff was held at Bayou Pointe, which the Berrys attended after lunch with the students.

Shreveport Campus Opens in Chase Building



The University of Louisiana Monroe College of Pharmacy is not new to the Shreveport area. In fact, it has maintained a campus close to its practice site at Ochsner LSU - Shreveport for 15 years. However, it is new to the downtown Shreveport area. Our vision has grown for this campus, and with that vision, changes were needed to accommodate the potential growth and expansion. Now, with the new location at 400 Texas Avenue, in the Chase Building, the university has the opportunity to make some of these visions a reality.

Over the past three months, renovations on the new suite took place to include administrative offices, a space for an interactive classroom, as well as a large student lounge necessary for the expansion of students on campus. Current plans include a possible transition into a 2+2 model of curriculum delivery, meaning more students will have the opportunity to spend time on the campus.

If we see this new model come to fruition, it will not only be adapted to our Shreveport location but will also expand to include our New Orleans campus.

The Shreveport campus currently houses 8 faculty members, including a Regional Dean, Associate Dean for Academic Affairs and the School Director for Clinical Sciences. An additional faculty member will be on-site at the end of August, and we are in the process of hiring a new administrative assistant. Our Shreveport faculty not only work with students in our practice sites but also teach a large number of classes both in-person and via distance through Zoom.

Our current setup sees on-site students as part of their last year (P4 year) of the professional program so there are typically 6-12 students on campus at a time. These student rotations take place at Ochsner LSU and include ambulatory care clinics in family

medicine, heart failure and oncology, as well as inpatient services for adults and pediatrics.

An open house was held on July 29 to showcase the newly renovated downtown space. Speakers included Shreveport Regional Dean, Dr Shawn Manor, ULM College of Pharmacy Dean, Dr. Glenn Anderson and ULM President, Dr. Ron Berry. Guests, including ULM faculty, students, alumni and some local Shreveport residents and business leaders, were treated to tours during the reception.

"We are excited about our integration into the downtown area and look forward to our students, faculty and staff being able to take advantage of all that downtown Shreveport has to offer." Dr. Shawn Manor, ULM College of Pharmacy Shreveport Regional Dean.
